



UNIVERSITY SYSTEM TRUSTEES TO MEET MARCH 15 IN BANGOR

BANGOR—The University of Maine System Board of Trustees will meet at the System Office in Bangor on Monday, March 15.

System Chancellor Richard L. Pattenaude will provide an update on the “New Challenges, New Directions” initiative, including a status report on the tuition, financial aid, and market study currently under way. He will also update Trustees on the UMFK president search process.

Among the agenda items, Trustees are expected to approve recommendations for tenure for faculty members, receive an update on collective bargaining, and be presented with status reports on various capital projects taking place at UMaine, UMF and USM.
