BANGOR—The University of Maine System Board of Trustees will meet on Monday, July 12, at the System Office located at 16 Central Street in Bangor.

Trustees will consider and are scheduled to act on several items, including:

- appointment of standing board committees;
- lease or acquisition of properties related to USM and UMaine;
- an interim academic reorganization at UMA;
- a new academic proposal at UMF.

In addition, Trustees will receive an update on the priorities and use of the University of Maine System strategic investment fund, established as part of the New Challenges, New Directions Initiative.
